Cybersecurity Funding

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) was passed in March 2021 to accelerate the country's recovery from the COVID-19 emergency and its negative economic impacts. As part of this legislation, states, local governments, tribal governments, schools, colleges, and hospitals received stimulus funding to rebound from the pandemic.

Several programs included in ARPA are technology-friendly and may be used for cybersecurity projects, including:

- Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal **Recovery Funds**
- **Elementary & Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund**
- **Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund**
- **HHS Provider Relief Fund**
